Our fiber is sourced from forest in Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia, and Kentucky. Our Fiber is supplied through certified chain of custody standards including Sustainability Forest Initiative (SFI) and the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) which prevent the illegal harvesting of wood.
